Our 2nd annual Spotlight on Literacy Benefit Dinner was held on April 29th. It was a special night celebrating our students' successes, our new business partnerships, and sharing our mission with new friends. Grant to Expand Workplace Literacy

We began holding ESL classes for **Cabdoor** employees in January of 2015. According to Cliff Stites, one of the owners and a tutor, the program is a win-win situation and has created "a culture of comradery" due to the diminished language barrier among employees.

The success of this pilot program led to a new business partnership with **Fjord, Ltd.** in Woodburn.

Fjord is a contract apparel manufacturer, cutting and sewing sportswear and athletic team uniforms. Fjord provides the space, a portion of the cost of books and pays the tutors' expenses. All students are taking classes on their own time. During the first term, five levels of ESL classes were held. One of the tutors is a former employee of Fjord, Pete Yazzolino. According to Pete, "the first three months already have

shown improvement through actual testing as well as a noticed improvement in self-confidence in using the English language."

We were honored to receive a grant from the Oregon Community Foundation to expand our Workplace Literacy program to manufacturing businesses. Our goal is to take these services to eight to ten local businesses in the next two years.

Volunteer Spotlight: Jody Horner

How long have you been a tutor? Two years. **What is the most memorable or funniest experience as a tutor?** I read the classic children's story: "The Three Little Pigs" to my students, which is the 3 pigs story from the perspective of the pigs. Then I read the story: "The True Story of the Three Pigs" to them, which is the same story, but from the perspective of the wolf. They were to listen to each story for the details and the probability of the events happening the way they were presented. Then they were asked to share which story they believed to be more true: the Pig's story or the Wolf's story and why. Adrian shared that he

believed the Wolf's story because he was polite and tried talking to the pigs first and all he wanted was a cup of sugar to make his dessert. He paused, and then he showed us a picture of him in his backyard with pork sausages on his barbecue. Then he said, "oh yeah, and because I like pork". **What do you like most about teaching adults?** I am so amazed at how hard they work to better their English and better their lives. Many of them have families and jobs and come to Mid Valley with a positive attitude, willing to take risks and soak up all that they are learning and ask for more. I love it when they reach that point where they are

comfortable enough to ask clarifying questions rather than the "nod and smile". **What is your favorite book?** I am always reading so I have lots of favorite books, but my all-time favorite is "To Kill a Mockingbird" and most recent favorite is "I Am Malala". **What would you like to learn to do?** It's something that I just recently learned to do: Climb. I am not afraid of heights, but I am afraid of falling. I have done it now 4 times with my son Jory, and each time it gets easier. It's all about perspective and problem solving. Plus I trust my son, Jory with my life as he is the one on the end of the rope I am dangling from.
